





"Can See Clearly Now Working with Grafix® Dura-Lar® Film

Objectives

Students will...

- Learn about the importance of contour line in direct observation work.
- Use Grafix® Dura-Lar® film to create mixed media masterpieces from direct observation.
- Learn about the importance of color harmony in a work of art.

Vocabulary


Have students study the contours of their hand, then give them the opportunity to practice drawing from observation by having them draw their hand in their sketchbook or visual journal.

Hand each student a 5" x 7" rectangle of Grafix® Dura-Lar® film (these will need to be cut out before class begins). Have students place the rectangle directly onto their hand, then trace what they see onto the film with a fine-tip Sharpie® pen. Students can then compare and contrast their first drawing of what they thought they saw when they looked at their hand with the second rendition of what they actually see.

Students should look at their sketches from the previous day and discuss the differences they see between their initial sketches and their transparency sketch.

- Students will look at items around the art room and select a specific object to draw in their sketchbook or visual journal. They should be sure to use contour to help them with the outer and inner outline and with the measuring details necessary to successfully draw from life.
- Use the Grafix® Dura-Lar® film to help draw the item in contour, similar to what they did when drawing their hand.

Students can now begin to create a composition, utilizing their hand drawings (if they choose) and their object drawings, layering these drawings with their film "practice" sheets.





Have students creatively adhere their transparency contour drawings over their mixed media works to showcase the lines and create movement in the work.

Mount final works onto black poster board for presentation.
